Marist Brothers 150th Anniversary

The Marist Brothers came to Scotland in 1858; their first house was in this parish, at Gargad Hill (Roystonhill) and they continued to live in Saint Mungo's parish until the 1970s when their house in Parson Street was demolished. On Friday of this week, Archbishop Conti will celebrate Mass in Saint Mungo's at 7.30 p.m. for the Feast of Saint Marcellin Champagnat, founder of the Marist Brothers. In this 150th anniversary year of the Marist Brothers in Scotland, Friday's Mass will be an occasion of thanksgiving to God for all that the Brothers have contributed to Catholic Education in our parish, our city and our country.

WYD Commissioning at Youth Mass: Next Sunday, at the monthly Youth Mass at 7.00 p.m., the young pilgrims who will go to Australia in July for the World Youth Day will be "sent on mission" by the priests, sisters and lay people of the Saint Mungo's Passionist community. Everyone is invited to be present to pray with and for those who will be going to the Passionist Youth Event in Melbourne and the World Day Day events and Mass with the Pope in Sydney. After the Mass, there will be a presentation of information about the Passionist Youth Event and the World Youth Day in the hall (with refreshments).

Saint Charles Icon: To mark the first anniversary of the Canonisation of Saint Charles of Mount Argus, there will be the blessing of a new Icon of Saint Charles on Saturday at the 12.15 Mass, after which the Icon will be installed in the Church, between the Sacred Heart altar and the altar of Saint Paul of the Cross.
