Saint Mungo's Academy Former Pupils Mass

Tomorrow (Monday) at 7.00 p.m., Bishop Philip Tartaglia will be principal celebrant at a Mass in Saint Mungo's to mark the 150th anniversary of the founding of Saint Mungo's Academy. This Mass, organised by the Former Pupils Association, coincides with the date of the opening of the Academy in 1858. Cardinal Keith O'Brien will preside at the Mass and will dedicate a new Icon of Saint Marcellin Champagnat, Founder of the Marist Brothers. The Mass will be followed by a buffet in the Middle Hall, where there will also be a small exhibition of photographs and artefacts from the Marist Brothers and the Academy. All are welcome.

Our Lady of Sorrows Novena: The Solemn Novena in honour of Our Lady of Sorrows begins on Sunday, 7 September and continues until Monday, 15 September. The Novena Service, which includes Mass, is at 12.15 and 7.30 p.m. on weekdays, 12.15 and 6.00 p.m. on Saturday, and 12.00 noon and 7.00 p.m. on Sundays.

During the novena, there will be no 6.00 p.m. Mass, except on Saturday.

Community Changes: Last weekend, we received news of some changes in the Passionist Community at Saint Mungo's which will take place around the eighth of December. Father Paul Francis will be moving to the parish of Saint Gabriel of Our Lady of Sorrows, Prestonpans, as parish priest. Father Marius will be moving to Saint Gabriel's Retreat, The Graan, Enniskillen. From December, the Rector of Saint Mungo's will be Father Dermot Gallagher C.P. and the new parish priest will be Father James Andrew Berrie C.P.

R.C.I.A. – Journey of Faith: The new R.C.I.A. session will begin later this year. The R.C.I.A. group exists to help adults who wish to prepare to be baptised or confirmed or who are interested in becoming Catholics. The group normally meets from the autumn until Pentecost. Meetings are held weekly and last about an hour and a half. The meeting includes a time of prayer, scripture reading, a chance to talk and share our faith together, and instruction on some aspect of the Catholic faith.
