Human Fertilisation and Embryology Bill

The Human Fertilisation and Embryology Bill will have its final House of Commons votes on Wednesday, 22 October. Radical pro-abortion amendments have been tabled for debate and voting on that day. Information leaflets from the Society for the Protection of Unborn Children are available at the Church door. The Society for the Protection of Unborn Children believes that the Government's decision to postpone the final stages of the Bill until now was influenced by the marvellous work done by courageous church leaders, church goers and pro-life supporters in opposing this profoundly unethical Bill. Please write again to your MP this week asking him/her to oppose any extension of the Abortion Act, including the proposed introduction of abortion into Northern Ireland, which is opposed by almost all Northern Ireland Assembly members and by all the major churches in Northern Ireland. You can write to your MP at: House of Commons, London SW1A 0AA or phone him/her through the parliamentary switchboard on 020 7219 3000. If you live in Townhead, your MP is Mohammad Sarwar. The MP for Sighthill, Royston and Springburn is Michael Martin. As Speaker, Mr Martin will not vote on the Bill, but it would still be helpful for him to receive a letter from you expressing your view. A postcard requesting your MP to vote against the Bill is available at the Church door.
