Mission Sunday

Today is Mission Sunday, the World Day of Prayer for the Missionary Work of the Church. The Second Collection today is for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. Today is also the Feast of Saint Paul of the Cross (1694-1775), the founder of the Passionists, who devoted his life to preaching the message of God's love, revealed in the Passion and Death of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Writings of Saint Paul of the Cross: In the Heart of God, a short book on the spiritual teaching of Saint Paul of the Cross published here at Saint Mungo's, is now available from the Bookshop, priced £2.95.

Human Fertilisation and Embryology Bill: The Human Fertilisation and Embryology Bill will have its final House of Commons votes on Wednesday of this week, 22 October. Radical pro-abortion amendments have been tabled for debate and voting on that day. Information leaflets from the Society for the Protection of Unborn Children are available at the Church door. Please write again to your MP this week asking him/her to oppose any extension of the Abortion Act. You can write to your MP at: House of Commons, London SW1A 0AA or phone him/her through the parliamentary switchboard on 020 7219 3000. If you live in Townhead, your MP is Mohammad Sarwar. The MP for Sighthill, Royston and Springburn is Michael Martin. As Speaker, Mr Martin will not vote on the Bill, but it would still be helpful for him to receive a letter from you expressing your view. A postcard requesting your MP to vote against the Bill is available at the Church door.
