'Peace be with you'

Today as we celebrate the second Sunday of Easter, we reflect on the words above. These are words from Jesus to his disciples when he appeared to them in the upper room after he had risen from the dead. These words are heard today in the same context that the disciples heard them – they are to help us be at one with God, and to let go of our worries about how we are to proclaim the Good News to others.

Jesus himself gives us the answer: 'Receive the Holy Spirit'.

This is where we will find the words and actions to reveal God's message of love for his people, and have the courage within ourselves to share that love wherever we go.

Peace be with you is God's message for all his people, let us all proclaim that news to our troubled world.

This is also Divine Mercy Sunday and there are special celebration throughout the Diocese.
