Today, we hear how after feeding the five thousand, Jesus and his disciples had left the people to go to the other side of the lake. The people realised this and went to find him and asked 'when did you come here?' Jesus then tells them that they must begin to understand the signs that they had seen. To realise that it is not simply about providing the material needs of the people. But it is in helping others and ourselves to understand the meaning of God's word. Jesus reminds us that we have been chosen by God, and that this should lead us to a belief in the one who was sent, that is, Jesus.

To do this, we should not, as St Paul says 'live the life of the aimless pagans'. We should instead adopt the way of Jesus. A way of friendship, compassion, understanding, care, generosity and love. This is the spiritual renewal of St Paul, this is the seal of God, this is the life of holiness that we receive through the Eucharist.

So perhaps this week, we could try to show the love of Jesus to everyone we meet. Then they will not have to go searching for Jesus, they will have found him in us.

So be renewed by a spiritual revolution and put on the new self that has been created in God.
